2015 FUNDING FOR HUMAN SERVICES

Funding Priorities Summary

County Fiscal Year (CFY) 2015 CHAPTER 51 Estimated - \$766,933

Subgrant Term: January 1, 2015 – December 31, 2015

Match Requirements: None

Minimum Funding Request: \$1,000

Funding Specifications: The use of Chapter 51 funds is strictly limited to meet the Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug treatment needs of those who lack the financial means to access treatment due to lack of insurance or the ability to self-pay. All applications for services must meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be appropriately licensed;
- Applicants must use service outcome measures and performance standards specific to the level of care; and maintain the highest standards of quality care.
- Demonstrate an ability to provide and/or refer to a continuum of care for individuals served.
- Agencies wishing to respond to the 2015 Chapter 51 Request for Application (RFA) must indicate what level of ASAM care they provide.

Based on identified priorities in the Morris County 2010-2014 Comprehensive Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Plan, program monitoring, quarterly reports and ongoing requests for services, the Department of Human Services is looking to purchase the following ASAM PPC-2R services to address the full continuum of care:

- **Level 0.5** **Early Intervention**
- **Level I** **Outpatient Services**
- **Level II.1** **Intensive Outpatient Services**
- **Level III.1** **Clinically Managed, Low-Intensity Residential Treatment**
- **Level III.3** **Clinically Managed, Medium-Intensity Residential Treatment**
- **Level III.5** **Clinically Managed, High-Intensity Residential Treatment**
- **Level III.7** **Medically Monitored Intensive Inpatient Treatment**
- **Level III.7D** **Subacute Detoxification Services**

Target Populations: Individuals with substance use disorders or at risk of substance abuse, including youth, adults, seniors, women, criminal offenders, individuals with disabilities and individuals with co-occurring disorders.

Special Considerations:

The County of Morris is committed to supporting positive systems change and client-centered, recovery oriented care, and will give special consideration to applications that address service gaps as follows:

- **Provide outreach and case management, including wraparound services, to engage individuals with co-occurring disorders with multiple service needs.**
- **Provide integrated services for the target populations, addressing multiple needs across systems, using interventions that take into account the individual's readiness (motivational interviewing).**
- **Provide or link clients to transportation.**
- **Address the specialized needs of aging in (17 -24 years) adults and seniors (over 60 years) with co-occurring mental health and addictions disorders.**
- **Provide Short-term and Long-term Residential Treatment services for Morris County adolescents referred from the Morris County Juvenile Detention Center and Morris County Youth Shelter.**
- **Recovery Support Services – Addressing health and wellness, home and community supports, and independent living skills.**
- **Prevention/Early Intervention – services that provide education and/or short term intervention for adolescents and their families, particularly those involved with probation or the juvenile justice system.**

Applicants must also include a copy of its NJ Division of Addiction Services License, financial screening, sliding fee scale forms and the latest financial audit. The County will not consider requests that do not include this information.

It is anticipated that the Chapter 51 funding will remain at level funding. However, should the County receive notification of a reduction in State or Federal funds, 2015 funding and/or future funding through this initiative may be reduced or terminated. Morris County will not be responsible for replacing or maintaining funding levels in the event that any possible reductions occur in the 2015 allocation process.

The County of Morris reserves the right to renew Subgrant agreements for the period of January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016, based upon annual program review and the availability of funding.
