Morris County Fiscal Year (CFY) 2017 Grant-In-Aid Estimated - \$659,193

Subgrant Term: January 1, 2017 – December 31, 2017

Match Requirements: None

Minimum Funding Request: \$1,000

Funding Specifications: Applications for general Grant-In-Aid services must meet the following criteria:

Provide support for individuals and families facing economic deprivation, family management and/or housing crisis.

Based on identified priorities in Morris County Human Services Planning Documents, program monitoring, quarterly reports and ongoing requests for services, the Department of Human Services is looking to purchase the following services:

- Housing services for individuals and families who are homeless/at-risk of homelessness, including the following:
 - Emergency shelter
 - Information and referral
 - Case management
 - Transitional housing
 - Housing assistance
 - Rapid Re-Housing, Tenant Based Rental Assistance, Support Services for Permanent Housing
- Services to Promote Self-Sufficiency in individuals and families, including the following:
 - Training/education
 - Child care
 - Transportation
 - Employment-related costs
 - Parent Education Programs
- Developmental and Social Adjustment Services for at-risk youth, including:
 - Case Management
 - Housing Assistance
- Domestic and Child Abuse Services, including the following:
 - Early intervention to prevent child abuse
 - Crisis intervention
 - Information and referral
 - Shelter

- Case management
- HIV/AIDS Services, including the following:
 - Housing services
 - Case management/Support Groups
 - Education

All 2017 applications will be reviewed by the Morris County Human Services Advisory Council. This review will determine 2017 Grant-In-Aid funding recommendations.

County Grant-In-Aid will be awarded based upon availability of funds for calendar year 2017.

Should the County receive notification of a reduction in State or Federal funds, 2017 funding through this initiative may be reduced or terminated. Morris County will not be responsible for replacing or maintaining funding levels in the event that any possible reductions occur in the 2017 allocation process.

The County of Morris reserves the right to renew Subgrant agreements for the period of January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, based upon annual program review and the availability of funding.
